

In the last 20 years I purchased several pressed steel "Model" toys by Doepke which I always wanted but were too expensive even for Santa!

What's special about the toy Met pictured above is it's legacy. It's one of four I purchase on ebay in 2010. Because the Highway 61 brand has such realistic detail, I used them to create our So Cal Mets logo. Positioning a toy at the preferred photographic angle is a lot simpler than moving an 1800 lb Met for a photo shoot.

So how did the Highway 61 <u>Toy</u> Met come about? If you were a MOCNA member in 2004 you might recall reading about it in the Met Gazette. For new Metters like me I find it fascinating and would like to share with you the details of the story. We all have John Riley from Dubuque Iowa to thank for this great little replica. John is our MOCNA Secretary although you may know him better as being part of the Met Tech Team & Ask Mr. Met page in the Gazette.

The Hwy 61 project was started the summer of 2003. The president of the Highway 61 Co. is the grandson of the founder of the Ertl Co. which started in Dubuque in the basement of his house about 4 blocks from where I grew up. They approached me to see if I was interested in using my car for the model, I of course said yes! They sent their photographer to our dealership for a day and he shot over 200 pictures of the car. The white stick is a carpenters rule taped every inch with black



tape.

They sent the photos to China and the engineers built a 1/12 size model off the pictures and returned it to the U.S. for us to make suggestions. The Chinese did an incredible job even on the first model, they even had the add on cruise control box under the dash, we had them remove that. The 1/12th was returned to China for the changes and again returned to the U.S. for evaluation this time in the 1/18 size. It was sent 2 more times for evaluation before production.

The cars were featured on the front cover of Toy & Model cars Magazine with articles in the Dec 2003 & Jan 2004 issues. I was not involved in the hardtop cars, that came later and I don't know if they used another car or just a picture. I am also sending a story that ran in the Gazette about the introduction at the International Toy Show.



INTERNATIONAL TOY SHOW ROSEMONT CONVENTION CENTER CHICAGO

The day for the introduction of the new Metropolitan 1/18 model from Hwy 61 was finally here! I drained the gas tank on our red Met and disconnected the battery, requirements for getting the car into the show arena. On the morning of Wend. Sept. 10, we hooked up the tow bar for the 200-mile trip to Chicago. After getting lost for an hour, they changed the name of the darn convention center; we finally arrived at about 1:30 PM. The car was unloaded and pushed to the Hwy 61 booth; there were a large group of onlookers with plenty of questions from the other people setting up at the show. The Hwy 61 folks started opening the boxes and we got our first look at the new Metropolitan models. They were far beyond our wildest dreams! The detail is incredible and the cost only \$49.95. Available to order at this time are two late model convertibles red and green. The convertible top comes off and there is a boot that comes with each car. The hood opens and is held up with the prop rod, the doors open exposing the interior with the seat that moves back and forth, and the backs fold ahead. The steering operates and the rear seat folds down. The trunk opens and exposes the jack and handle. As the car is pushed the drive shaft turns the trans, and engine, the front engine pulley turns the fan with the fan belt. Get your order in early at 1-877-874-5467 as they expect the Met to be their best selling model ever. Thurs, and Fri. of the show was open only for the hobby shop dealers and Hwy 61 took plenty of orders. The Sat. and Sun. show was open to the public. We returned to the show on Sun, and there were mobs of people. They had race tracks set up to run the remote cars on, a lake to race the remote boats on, and a caged in area to fly remote planes. I think every Model toy in the world was represented there. The Metropolitans were the stars of the show! The show closed at 5:00 PM on Sun. We hooked up the Met for the trip home and left after a wonderful weekend. On the way home it seemed that every time we stopped we were deluged with questions about the Met. We were glad to answer all the questions. It sure looks like this new Met model will create a lot of exposure for the Metropolitan and our hobby.

If you have the Highway 61 toy, lift the hood and note that there are two hood prop rods (not standard) just like John's car.


