



We started in old town Tustin and worked our way up to Santiago Canyon, then Modjeska Canyon where we visited the Helena Modjeska House and grounds. Built in 1888, it is the only surviving home of Helena Madjeska, a Shakespearean actress and Polish patriot. It is one of only three U.S. National Landmarks in Orange County. The other two are the Old Court House in Santa Ana and Mission San Juan Capistrano. Docents split us into two groups and provided very interesting tours for us. There are only a few MOCNA members in Europe, but Rina has a passion for Metropolitans worth noting. Rina has been a member of MOCNA since 1998. (She proudly shows her 5 & 10 year pins). On the 50th anniversary of the Metropolitan, she attended the International Meet in Detroit, Michigan in 2003! (She kindly gave us her 8x10 flyer from that event).

Among her 22 visits to the United States, she attended the 2005 International meet in Astoria, Oregon. She proudly showed us her plaque from that visit giving her the "furthest traveled" award. 

Meet Dave and Diana Heller. They live in Cypress. They drove their hard top over to our Craig Park picnic area and joined our group of fifteen Mets. They are new members in our Metropolitan community, but their Metropolitan, is not so unknown to the Metropolitan world!

Mid November 2015 Dave first contacted us because he had recently been blessed with the 1960 Metropolitan (above) and wanted to join our So Cal Mets group.

Not long afterwards MOCNA membership leader Betty Jacobson kindly granted Dave MOCNA membership #9509. Now 9509 was not a new number in the register of MOCNA members. But as Radio personality Paul Harvey used to say "Now for the rest of the story":

MOCNA member 9509 was originally Mary Rusko Gregovich. The inspiring story about Mary and her Met was first told by Wayne Metz to the Met Gazette in May 2010. Steve Robertson reprinted Wayne's heartening story in the November 2015 Met Gazette because Mary had succumbed to Parkinson's disease at 89.

In essence, in 1960, while single & living in a San Francisco flat with girlfriends, Mary Rusko bought



the Met on the condition that the salesman teach her how to drive. Mary married Milan Gregovich a year later and in the following years of marriage they went through several cars but always hung on to Mary's Met. Fast forward, one of Mary's three sons married Dave & Diana Heller's daughter. After Mary's passing the Gregovich family felt Dave Heller was the most logical one to care for the car. Oh yes, Betty Jacobson let the Heller's keep Mary's old MOCNA number 9509.
