





It's located in front of the drivers side engine firewall neatly hidden under what is called the "Dash to wheelhouse panel brace. See (Figure 28).

The solution: I loosened the nut a bit more. Then had an assistant turn the horn & signal lever back to the 12:00 O'clock position and hold it, while I then tightened the nut. I was cautioned not to over tighten the net.


