





T hanks to several Met owners for advise on this subject. Thanks especially to Dale Carrington from the PNMOC chapter for tearing an old distributor apart to understand the manual's recommended lube locations . Here are Dale's conclusions. Other photos are available. The Met Manual by Clymer says that every thousand miles put a few drops of machine oil through the opening at the edge of the contact breaker cam to lube the automatic spark advance mechanism (Location A). Apply a <u>light film</u> of high melting (white) grease to the cam and pivot (Location B). Remove the rotor and apply a few drops of machine oil to the shaft to lube the cam bearing (Location C).

Thanks to all who donated the array of quality things to be sold & for your participation in the 50/50 raffle. Gwen Tolleson reported that we netted \$1488.00!


