

I do have reservations about the value of "local" groups because they do not reach every chapter member. Of the forty some members in our chapter only half of them are Facebook members and only half of them are active.






The members of the Pacific NW Met Owners Club and British Columbia Mets invite you to "Come Play in Our Yard" in the beautiful Pacific Northwest!
