

Both the Orange County Register and the Los Angeles Times had articles about the passing of Ruby Cavanaugh. The December publications paid tribute to many notable Southland folks who left us in 2015. We are pleased to recall that Ruby Cavanaugh had a sweet connection to our Metropolitans.

Ruby is pictured above with her son Doug Cavanaugh at one of the many restaurants named after her. The year was 2008 and the Cavanaughs were there for a publicity photo shoot. The Food Channel was video taping a segment for their "Unwrapped" series. Metropolitan owners were invited becausewell there was a familiar icon permanently mounted behind the new hostess station. The location was at the Citadel Outlet Center alongside I-5 in East Los Angeles.



Down on Newport Beach's Balboa Peninsula and just a beach vollyball throw from the site of the former Rendezvous Ball Room, stands the Ballboa Pier. In 1982 Doug & a friend opened their first restaurant on the end of the pier. He themed it after his mother's favorite era, the 1940's. The whimiscal item that greeted you there was a beautifully restored Bumper Car.

Ruby's Diner now has 35 locations in California, Neveda, New Jersery, Pennsylvania and Texas.

Ruby enjoyed being part of the company's growth, serving as a greeter at openings. In 2009 she attended the Unique Little Car Show at the Citadel Center which received great support from the Restaurant chain. That day she was wearing a spunky all black leather outfit and was happy to autograph a free photo of her on a Harley. 


Forty nine years ago the "5th Dimension" had a hit with their song "Up Up & Away". Some of the lyrics are show above.




