


Mets Pose With The Past





Below is the station when it really pumped gas.












After a great visit to the world of Packards, we all went to lunch lunch at a local Mexican restaurant. Ron Bauman picked up the tab. Thank you Mr. President.



The lure of having a minted Metropolitan coin was enough to drive to Palmdale. The seekers were Gwen Tolleson & Tony Bilotti. It was 2010 and Keith Hays had told Gwen that Cliff Kos was selling his unique coinage. Not one to pass up anything Metropolitan (Tony especially), they paid Cliff a visit and did buy some cool coins. During that visit they learned that Cliff had at one time owned some thirty Mets, which were unfortunately destroyed in a fire on his property. For years thereafter he was down in the dumps about Metropolitans. He did however finally give in to Metropolitanitis & purchased another Met, a 1960 Berkshire Green hardtop from a guy named Jim.

Cliff's account of his buying the Met is taken from his hand written note, which the present owner, Marcia Jones, shares with us here:

"Jim wanted \$10,000 because he and his grandfather had \$14,000 in it. He finally came down to \$8,000. After discussing all with him...he was getting divorced and needed money for a lawyer. His lawyer's fee was \$6,500 and he was fairly amicable. I told him no - that 's too little and offered him \$6,543.21 and

he accepted! I had Keith and his brother check it out and Keith said I am very good friends with the company Jim claims did the work at \$14,000. (*We think the "Company" in this case was the Metropolitan Pit Stop*). Keith and Darrell Hays said they would check it out the next day. Keith said at \$8,000 grab it. So I told him, the owner, I would like to have it if he delivered it and produced proof of the \$14,000 work performed! He delivered it in 2 weeks and I checked the pan! Slight surface rust - but NO holes. I did this while Yvonne was showing him our Koi. From that instant that METRO was mine and my ancestors. At this instant the car is so perfect I am tempted to wrap it in plastic and suck the air out and never drive it. This should be a gift for the future. Right now I am looking at autographed pictures of the man who designed this car, William J. Flajole and George Romney, the president of American Motors who sold the car and a candidate for US Vice President. Jim's work was \$15,130 plus the price of the original car... whatever that was. at this moment, if someone offered me \$20,000 I would laugh at them ... 3 1/2 times what I paid for it... 24 hours ago. It appears I'm in Metro traffic again. The goodies I have left from my last excursion before the 1/2 million dollar documented fire loss will be added to the price of the car. There is a God! I hope to offer the 51 Kaiser to poor vagabond Jay Leno".
